Crapemyrtle

Lagerstroemia indica 'Whit I' Cultivar

Raspberry Sundae® has unique flowers, raspberry red with a touch of white, which are distinctly fragrant. The plant is sterile, producing only a very few seed pods. Growth habit of Raspberry Sundae® is distinctly upright and columnar. Because viable seeds are not produced, pruning is not required. Raspberry Sundae® grows and flowers best when NOT pruned back in the winter. Remember, pruning is always stunting. Flowering is best in full sun.

Features

- Flowers: raspberry red with white margin. Less white during hot conditions.
- Flowers are fragrant.
- Flower buds: crimson
- Foliage: crimson new leaves, change to bronze then to dark green.
- Fall color: orange
- Growth habit: Single or multiple stem, very large shrub or small tree, columnar, 20 feet or more in height
- Very drought tolerant
- Mildew may occur under severe conditions or where air movement is restricted and/or plant is in part shade.

Crapemyrtle grow best and flower most profusely in full sun. Crapemyrtle will grow in most soils, however the better the plant growth, the more flowers. Water during droughts for better flowering. Fertilize moderately ONLY in spring, do not fertilize crapemyrtle in the fall.
